# **Administrative Update**

## **General Health Officer Update:**

- Continued to participate in State and County Health Officer conference calls and meetings to discuss public health updates and share information related to vaccine updates, and various public health activities.
- Continued to monitor CDC and NJDOH websites for guidance documents and provide updates accordingly.
- Continued to oversee inspections, complaints, inquiries, and correspondence.
- The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued a Health Update on March 18th on the ongoing risk of dengue virus (DENV) infections in the US due to elevated numbers of dengue cases in the Americas region. Spring and summer travel in the US overlaps with the months of increased seasonal dengue activity in many countries. Physicians are asked to maintain a high suspicion for DENV for patients with fever and travel to areas with DENV transmission in the 14 days before illness onset. If DENV is suspected, order RT-PCR AND IgM antibody tests OR NS1 antigen AND IgM antibody tests. Consider tests for other arboviruses, including Zika, Chikungunya, and Oropouche.

Levels for influenza A are decreasing while type B are increasing. The current predominant influenza virus is type B and is included in the 2024-25 influenza vaccine.
- Recent Covid-19 and influenza hospitalizations have mostly been reported in person 65 years.

# **Administrative Update**

# **General Health Officer Update:**

- Continued to participate in State and County Health Officer conference calls and meetings to discuss public health updates and share information related to vaccine updates, and various public health activities.
- Continued to monitor CDC and NJDOH websites for guidance documents and provide updates accordingly.
- Continued to oversee inspections, complaints, inquiries, and correspondence.
- NJLINCs released air quality alerts due to the wildfires in Ocean County;
   correspondence, including actions to protect health on poor air quality days, was sent to the Borough and posted on social media.
- H5N1 testing is available at the NJ Department of Agriculture's Animal Health Diagnostic Laboratory (NJAHDL) for cats or dogs with compatible clinical signs and risk factors for exposure to H5N1. Cats are susceptible to Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) A (H5N1) and may become infected via ingesting contaminated raw meat, raw dairy products, or via exposure to infected animals. Severe illness and death may occur.
- H5N1 can also be transmitted to dogs, but there have not been any cases of H5N1
  reported in the United States at this time, and they may have a lower risk and milder
  illness/lower mortality rates compared to infected cats
